



As part of the New Haven School Change Initiative, The City of New Haven, New Haven Public Schools, and United Way of Greater New Haven have created an exciting new partnership - Boost! - designed to coordinate wraparound services that will support students' development and enhance their ability to focus and learn in the classroom. We believe that the Boost! partnership will help us achieve our common goals: to reduce the achievement gap between New Haven and the rest of the state, cut the dropout rate in half, and ensure every graduating student has the academic ability and financial resources to attend and succeed in college.

In order to coordinate community resources, Boost! will collaborate with community-based and nonprofit organizations, parents, government agencies, businesses, and schools to ensure students receive supports and services in the following four areas:

- Physical Health
- **Emotional and Behavioral Health**
- **Extended Learning Opportunities**
- Family Support and Engagement

For the 2010-2011 school year, Boost! is being piloted in five schools, and will expand to all New Haven Public Schools over next five years. The pilot schools are Augusta Lewis Troup School, Barnard Environmental Studies Magnet School, Clinton Avenue School, Metropolitan Business Academy and Wexler-Grant Community School.

As part of the Boost! effort to improve access to community resources, the partnership has produced this Resource Guide, which is mapped to the four focus areas of Boost!. This guide is meant to help inform parents, students, schools, and the community about available programs and services for children and families in the New Haven region. In the future, our vision is to have all this information available in one easy online location. For now, we encourage you to take advantage of the organizations and programs summarized in this guide, as well as the existing online resources that were utilized to create it: United Way of Connecticut 2-1-1 and New Haven Youth Map.
