

2018 DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey Greater New Haven Crosstabs

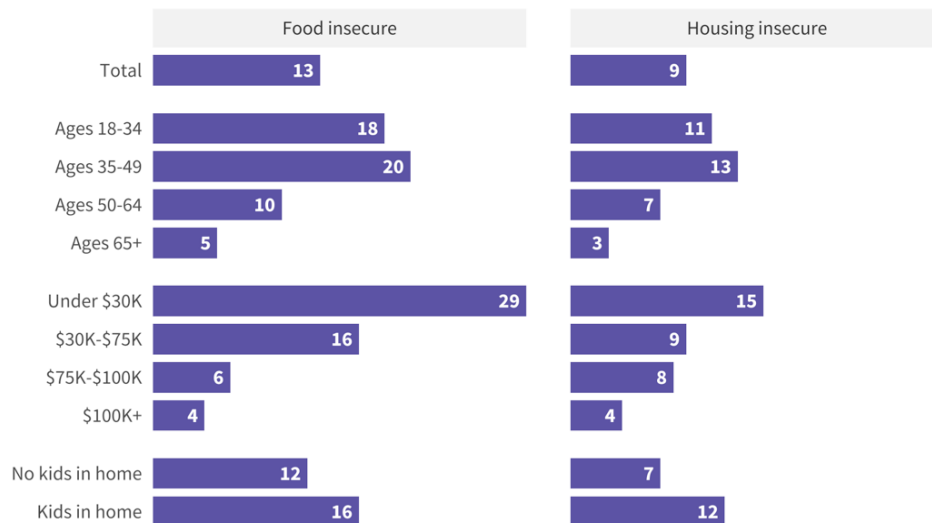
Results Overview

These crosstabs contain data collected through the 2018 DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey's live, in-depth interviews with 16,043 individuals statewide, including 2,367 in Greater New Haven. The survey assessed topics such as health, employment, and neighborhood resources. Respondents spanned a broad range of ages, ethnicities, and socioeconomic statuses from every Connecticut zip code, and all results are based on weighting survey data to be representative of the entire adult population (see methodology). Data collected at this level reveal local trends in quality of life, including these examples:

Access to nutritious food and housing are inequitable: Food insecurity burdens some groups more than others: Thirteen percent of adults reported food insecurity, a figure that increased to 29% among people making under \$30,000. Food insecurity also affects homes with kids at a higher rate (16%) than homes without kids (12%), a trend that is mirrored in housing insecurity. And access to healthy food is also an issue: 62% of black and 52% of Latino adults reported good or excellent access to affordable fresh fruits and vegetables in their neighborhood, versus 75% of whites.

Percent of Greater New Haven adults having difficulty paying for food or housing in past year by age, income, and presence of children, 2018

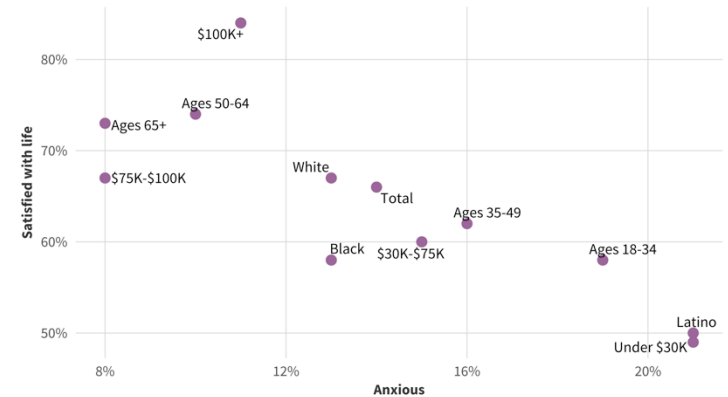


Life satisfaction varies between demographic groups: Sixty-six percent of Greater New Haven adults reported feeling at least mostly satisfied with their life, but this figure was much lower in Latino or low-income adults: only roughly half of

Latino adults or adults making less than \$30,000 in Greater New Haven felt mostly or completely satisfied with their life. Life satisfaction also appeared to correlate with anxiety, and Latino adults and adults making less than \$30,000 had the highest reported anxiety (21% of both groups, compared to 14% across all adults in Greater New Haven).

Percent of Greater New Haven adults mostly/completely satisfied with life vs percent of adults mostly/completely anxious by age, race, and income, 2018

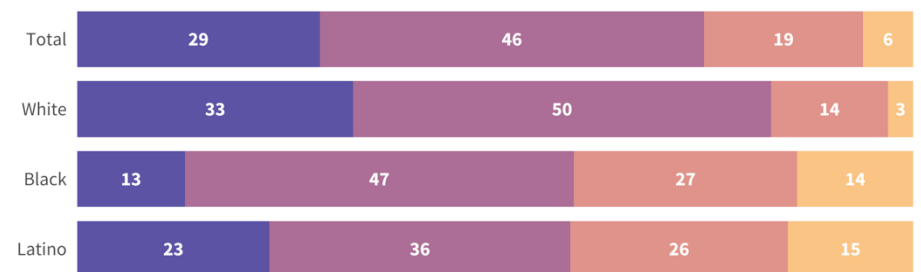


Latino adults or adults making less than \$30,000 in Greater New Haven felt mostly or completely satisfied with their life. Life satisfaction also appeared to correlate with anxiety, and Latino adults and adults making less than \$30,000 had the highest reported anxiety (21% of both groups, compared to 14% across all adults in Greater New Haven).

Experiences with the police vary by race: Black and Latino adults in Greater New Haven are much less favorable about the police than white adults. Only 60 percent and 59 percent of black and Latino adults, respectively, said the local police are doing a good or excellent job, compared to 83 percent of white adults. And compared to whites (8%), nearly three times as many Latino (20%) and black (23%) individuals reported they experienced unfair or abusive treatment by the police multiple times in the past 3 years.

Responses to job done by local police by race; percent of Greater New Haven adults, 2018

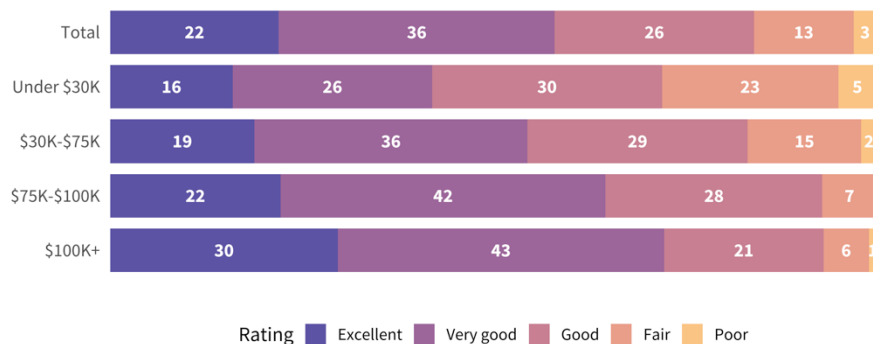


Response: Excellent Good Fair Poor

Higher-earning adults report better health: Among individuals with annual incomes greater than \$100,000, 30% reported excellent health, compared to 16% reporting the same among individuals with incomes below \$30,000. Every health condition included on the survey was more prevalent in lower-income respondents, including obesity, hypertension, diabetes, heart disease/heart attack, and asthma.

High-income adults rate their health more highly

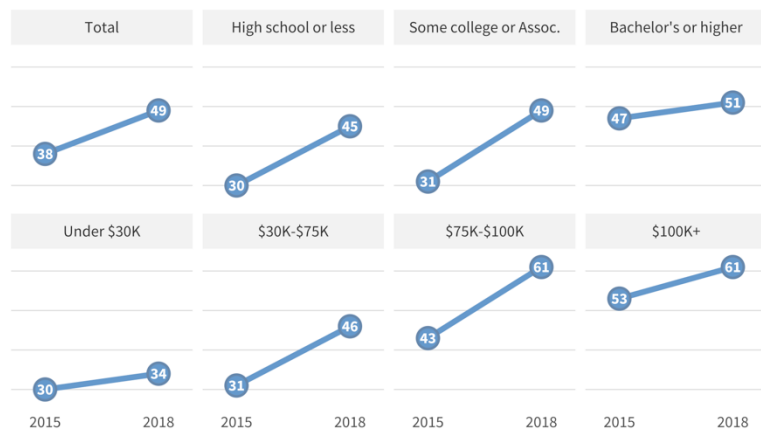
Responses to self-rated health by income; percent of Greater New Haven adults, 2018



Job prospects are improving: Adults in Greater New Haven appear to feel more confident in the availability of suitable jobs. In 2018, 49% of Greater New Haven adults reported that city residents are able to find suitable employment, compared to 38% in 2015. Although adults with more education and higher incomes still have the most optimism about job opportunities, sentiments improved across all education levels and income brackets.

Across education and income, adults see increasing job prospects

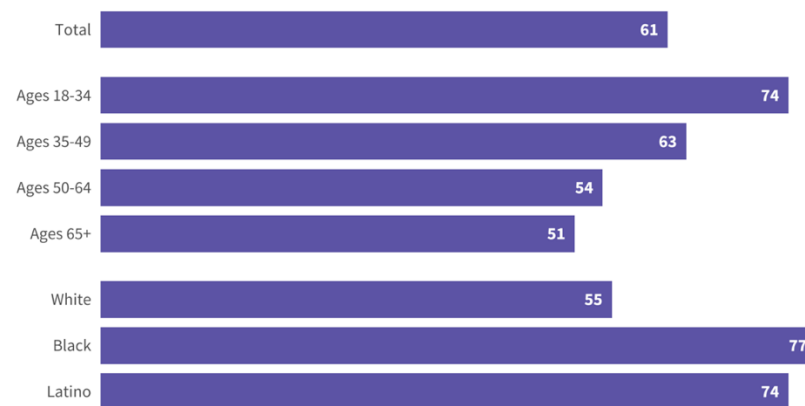
Percent of Greater New Haven adults reporting that residents are able to find suitable employment by education and income, 2015-2018



Young adults and non-white adults are within walking distance of more amenities: In Greater New Haven, 61% of adults are within walking distance of amenities like stores and banks. This is higher than the statewide figure (54%). But, certain demographics find themselves even more conveniently situated. Seventy-four percent of adults between 18-34, 77% of black adults, and 74% of Latino adults are in walking distance of amenities. These demographic groups also find that it is safe to walk on the sidewalks/crosswalks in their neighborhoods (73% of adults between 18-34, 82% of black adults, and 82% of Latino adults, compared to 67% of Greater New Haven adults overall.)

Younger adults, Black and Latino adults see more amenities in walking distance

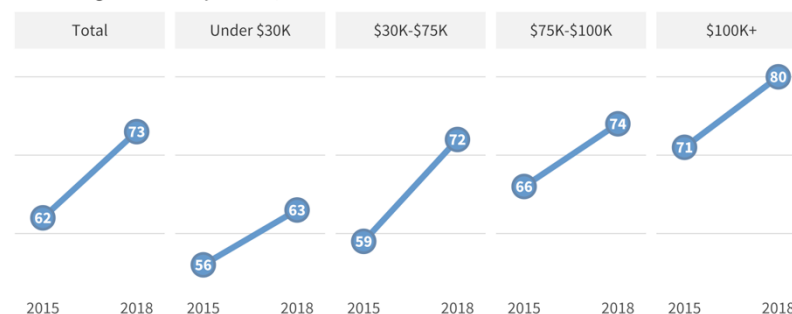
Percent of Greater New Haven adults with stores, etc. in walking distance by age and race, 2018



Local government is listening to residents better: Seventy-three percent of Greater New Haven adults feel that they have at least some influence over local government, an 11-point jump from the 62% reporting the same in 2015. All income brackets saw an increase in influence on local government.

How To Read This Document

The data in these crosstabs represent question-by-question weighted estimates, disaggregated by various demographic and socioeconomic characteristics. Each estimate represents how a group of respondents—weighted to be representative of the population within the specified geographic area—answered the question shown.

Please use caution in interpreting the information here, and consider the limitations of the populations from which the data was collected. In particular, please be aware of “skip patterns” in the survey, such as *“Q23E1. (If still have asthma) During the past 30 days, how often have you used a prescription asthma inhaler during an asthma attack to stop it?”* Only the subset of adults who indicated in the previous two questions that they had been diagnosed with asthma and still have it would have been eligible to receive this question. Therefore, the estimates show the percentages of adults with “current asthma” who have used inhalers, not the percentages of all adults who have used them.

The number of respondents to any given question is represented by “Weighted Total.” For example, many questions were answered by all 2,367 Greater New Haven respondents, so in the Greater New Haven column you will see a Weighted Total of 2,367. But the columns for each smaller population group (e.g., adults age 18-34) or the columns for questions that were asked only to a subset of adults will have smaller weighted totals. Generally, columns with demographic breakdowns are only included when the number of respondents completing that item was at least 50. Additionally, some questions were asked to special groupings of respondents or “ballots.” Respondents were randomly-assigned to one of three statewide ballots (split 45%, 45%, and 10%) at the outset of the survey. For these questions (e.g., Q5, asked to 10% of adults, giving a Weighted Total of 244 people), weighted totals are generally smaller than they are for the questions that were asked to 100% of eligible respondents.

Methodology

The DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey was designed by DataHaven in consultation with over 100 local, statewide, and national survey research experts and local partners, in many cases drawing upon questions commonly used in other surveys.

On behalf of DataHaven, the Siena College Research Institute (SRI) conducted the survey of 16,043 residents of the state of Connecticut, including 2,367 in Greater New Haven (additional surveys were also completed in parts of New York State, but are not included in these estimates). Surveys were conducted from March 6 through November 29, 2018. Residents age 18 and older were interviewed from all 169 towns in Connecticut. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish. The overall Connecticut sample of 16,043 and the Greater New Haven sample of 2,367 were weighted by age, gender, reported race, and geography to ensure that they were statistically representative of the area’s demographics. In addition to demographic parameters, the samples were also

weighted to match current patterns of telephone status (landline only, cell phone only or both), based on the state-level estimates from the National Health Interview Survey.

Respondents were contacted via landline or cell phone. To ensure the selection of both listed and unlisted telephone numbers, the design of the sample incorporated random digit dialing (RDD). The cell phone sample was drawn from a sample of dedicated wireless telephone exchanges from within Connecticut. Approximately 1/3 of residents completed the survey on a cell phone. In addition to the traditional RDD samples for landline and cell, we augmented the sample using a stratified sampling technique. These stratified samples maintained RDD for both landline and cell but used information from the U.S. Census so as to enhance the composition of the sample, including targeted regions, urban centers, and high concentrations of minority populations. The primary supplier of the RDD landline and cell phone samples was Survey Sampling International (SSI) of Shelton, Connecticut. Additionally, for the cell phone sample we utilized SSI’s Wireless LITe database which uses billing address to enable the targeting of cell phone sample by region or zip code. This database also permitted the inclusion of non-Connecticut telephone numbers as someone may have moved and their billing address is in the area but their cell phone number is not a ‘typical’ Connecticut telephone number (i.e., not a 203, 860 area code). All of these respondents were screened by live interviewers to confirm their residence in a qualifying town and zip code before interviews continued.

Reported Margins of Error

Margins of error are shown at the top of the crosstab. The “maximum” margin of error for the Greater New Haven sample of 2,367 adults is +/- 2.5% with a 95% confidence interval, including the design effects resulting from weighting. This means that in 95 out of every 100 samples of the same size and type, the results that we obtain would never vary by more than plus or minus 2.5 percentage points from the result that we would get if we could interview every single member of the adult population of Connecticut. This maximum margin of error applies when an observed percentage is 50%, and the margin of error becomes smaller as the percentage approaches the extremes of 0% or 100%. Margins of error are higher for small geographic or population groups.
