

# 2018 DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey

## New London Crosstabs

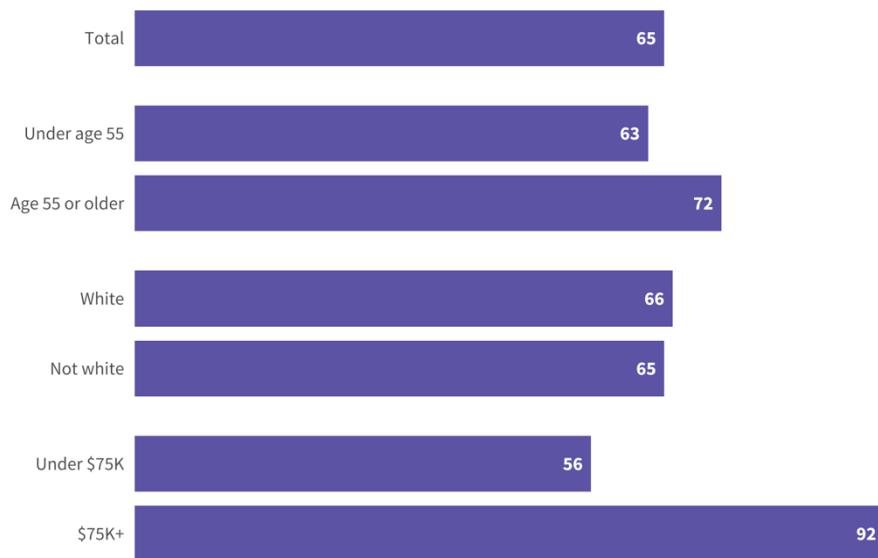
### Results Overview

These crosstabs contain data collected through the 2018 DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey's live, in-depth interviews with 16,043 individuals statewide, including 210 in New London. The survey assessed topics such as health, employment, and neighborhood resources. Respondents spanned a broad range of ages, ethnicities, and socioeconomic statuses from every Connecticut zip code, and all results are based on weighting survey data to be representative of the entire adult population (see methodology). Data collected at this level reveal local trends in quality of life, including these examples:

**Neighborhood satisfaction is low:** Sixty-five percent of adults are satisfied with the area in which they live, much less than the statewide figure of 82%. New London adults are less satisfied than their statewide peers about everything from safety to local government, and only 47% think New London is at least a good place to raise children (compared to 75% of Connecticut adults). Some groups are even less satisfied with the area, including low-income adults (only 56% of adults making less than \$75,000 were satisfied.) This group is also more critical of the responsiveness of local government: only 27% felt that local government was responsive and 33% felt they had at least moderate influence on local-government decision-making, compared to 33% and 47%, respectively, among people with incomes over \$75,000.

### Experiences with the police vary by race:

Non-white adults in New London have generally more negative interactions with the police: Compared to whites (14%), 21% of non-white individuals reported they experienced

Percent of New London adults reporting unfair police stops, searches, or other mistreatment by race, 2018

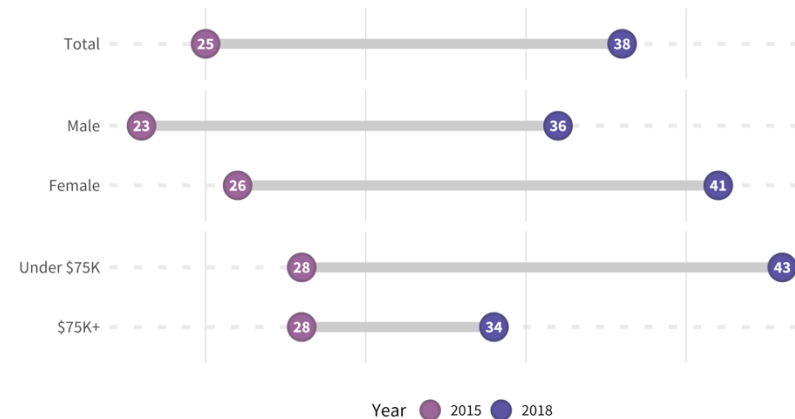


unfair or abusive treatment by the police. The rate of such encounters in New London is 17% across all adults, which is higher than the statewide rate of 11%. This may play a role in overall dissatisfaction with the police: Only 54% of New London adults think the police are doing at least a good job, compared to 78% of Connecticut adults.

**Women and low-income adults are increasingly likely to postpone medical care:** Around half of New London adults report excellent or very good health, but women and lower-income individuals report worse health. Among these two groups, 41% percent of women and 43% of adults with incomes below \$75,000 said they had postponed getting medical care in the last 12 months, and these numbers have grown substantially since 2015. Also growing? The uninsured rate. Only 85% of New London adults reported having health insurance in 2018, compared to 94% in 2015.

## How To Read This Document

The data in these crosstabs represent question-by-question weighted estimates, disaggregated by various demographic and socioeconomic characteristics. Each estimate represents how a group of respondents—weighted to be representative of the population within the specified geographic area—answered the question shown.

Please use caution in interpreting the information here, and consider the limitations of the populations from which the data was collected. In particular, please be aware of “skip patterns” in the survey, such as “Q23E1. (If still have asthma) During the past 30 days, how often have you used a prescription asthma inhaler during an asthma attack to stop it?” Only the subset of adults who indicated in the previous two questions that they had been diagnosed with asthma and still have it would have been eligible to receive this question. Therefore, the estimates show the percentages of adults with “current asthma” who have used inhalers, not the percentages of all adults who have used them.

The number of respondents to any given question is represented by “Weighted Total.” For example, many questions were answered by all 210 New London respondents, so in the New London column you will see a Weighted Total of 210. But the columns for each smaller population group (e.g., adults age 18-34) or the columns for questions that were asked only to a subset of adults will have smaller weighted totals. Generally, columns with demographic breakdowns are only included when the number of respondents completing that item was at least 50. Additionally, some questions were asked to special groupings of respondents or “ballots.” Respondents were randomly-assigned to one of three statewide ballots (split 45%, 45%, and 10%) at the outset of the survey. For these questions (e.g., question LIFECA, asked to 45% of adults, giving a Weighted Total of 85 people), weighted totals are generally smaller than they are for the questions that were asked to 100% of eligible respondents.

## Methodology

The DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey was designed by DataHaven in consultation with over 100 local, statewide, and national survey research experts and local partners, in many cases drawing upon questions commonly used in other surveys.

On behalf of DataHaven, the Siena College Research Institute (SRI) conducted the survey of 16,043 residents of the state of Connecticut, including 210 in New London (additional surveys were also completed in parts of New York State, but are not included in these estimates). Surveys were conducted from March 6 through November 29, 2018. Residents age 18 and older were interviewed from all 169 towns in Connecticut. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish. The overall Connecticut sample of 16,043 and the New London sample of 210 were weighted by age, gender, reported race, and geography to ensure that they were statistically representative of the area’s demographics. In addition to demographic parameters, the samples were also weighted

to match current patterns of telephone status (landline only, cell phone only or both), based on the state-level estimates from the National Health Interview Survey.

Respondents were contacted via landline or cell phone. To ensure the selection of both listed and unlisted telephone numbers, the design of the sample incorporated random digit dialing (RDD). The cell phone sample was drawn from a sample of dedicated wireless telephone exchanges from within Connecticut. Approximately 1/3 of residents completed the survey on a cell phone. In addition to the traditional RDD samples for landline and cell, we augmented the sample using a stratified sampling technique. These stratified samples maintained RDD for both landline and cell but used information from the U.S. Census so as to enhance the composition of the sample, including targeted regions, urban centers, and high concentrations of minority populations. The primary supplier of the RDD landline and cell phone samples was Survey Sampling International (SSI) of Shelton, Connecticut. Additionally, for the cell phone sample we utilized SSI’s Wireless LITe database which uses billing address to enable the targeting of cell phone sample by region or zip code. This database also permitted the inclusion of non-Connecticut telephone numbers as someone may have moved and their billing address is in the area but their cell phone number is not a ‘typical’ Connecticut telephone number (i.e., not a 203, 860 area code). All of these respondents were screened by live interviewers to confirm their residence in a qualifying town and zip code before interviews continued.

## Reported Margins of Error

Margins of error are shown at the top of the crosstab. The “maximum” margin of error for the New London sample of 210 adults is +/- 9.8% with a 95% confidence interval, including the design effects resulting from weighting. This means that in 95 out of every 100 samples of the same size and type, the results that we obtain would never vary by more than plus or minus 9.8 percentage points from the result that we would get if we could interview every single member of the adult population of Connecticut. This maximum margin of error applies when an observed percentage is 50%, and the margin of error becomes smaller as the percentage approaches the extremes of 0% or 100%. Margins of error are higher for small geographic or population groups.
