

2025 DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey Connecticut Crosstabs

Overview

These crosstabs contain data collected through the DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey's in-depth interviews with 1,371 randomly-selected adults in Connecticut from August 4 to October 16, 2025. Conducted since 2012, the DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey assesses issues such as quality of life, health, employment, and neighborhood resources. All results are based on weighting survey data to be representative of the entire adult population (see methodology below and Sample Demographics page). The maximum margin of error for the Connecticut sample is +/- 3.5% with a 95% confidence interval including the design effects resulting from weighting. This means that in 95 out of every 100 samples of the same size and type, the results we obtain would vary by no more than plus or minus 3.5 percentage points from the result we would get if we could interview every member of the population. This maximum margin of error applies when the observed proportion of respondents answering a question is exactly 50% (e.g., if 50% say that there are well-maintained parks in their neighborhood), but the margin of error becomes much smaller as that proportion approaches the extremes of 0% or 100%.

How To Read This Document

The data in these crosstabs represent question-by-question weighted estimates, disaggregated by selected demographic and socioeconomic characteristics. Each estimate represents how a group of respondents-weighted to be representative of the population within the specified geographic area-answered the question shown. **Please use caution in interpreting the information in this document. We recommend contacting DataHaven with any questions, at info [at] ctdatahaven.org. DataHaven staff can help confirm whether the information in this document is being interpreted in a correct way, and we can recommend further analysis that might be useful to your work.**

In particular, when reading the document, be aware of branching or "skip patterns" in the survey, such as Q49, "During this time, has your job been full time or part time?" Only the subset of adults who indicated in the previous question that they had a paid job would have been eligible to receive this question. Therefore, the estimates in that section of the crosstab show the percentages of adults with paid jobs who have full time jobs, not the percentages of all adults who have full time jobs. **These follow-up questions that are only asked to survey respondents who meet certain criteria are highlighted in light blue. A few of the suggested indicators to use, often based on combining results from several of these follow-up questions, are highlighted in orange.**

These crosstabs also include three index items (health care access score, financial security score, and community assets score) calculated based on several survey questions each. On each of these, survey respondents are given a score from 0 to 1,000, where 1,000 represents ideal conditions across all questions. The indices are the averages of those scores by group. These abstracted scores allow for comparing broader topics across groups and locations. Contact DataHaven for details on score definitions.

Generally, columns with demographic breakdowns are included only when the number of respondents completing that specific survey item was sufficiently large for reporting. Additionally, please note that some questions were not asked to all respondents, due to branching. For example, respondents were randomly-assigned to one of three statewide "ballots" at the outset of the survey. This approach allows for a larger number of questions to be included in the survey. **The demographic categories shown in the crosstab are determined based on responses to detailed survey questions on age, sex, race/ethnicity, place of birth, presence of children in the household, sexual orientation, gender identity, income, education, Connecticut town of residence, and other characteristics or experiences.** Where available, a disability categorization is based on respondents who answered yes to any of the standard 6-item screener question for having a disability. The incarceration experience questions are only asked to men who are ages 18 to 64. Sexual orientation and gender identity are broken down in several ways: as an umbrella term, LGBTQ denotes any adults who identify themselves as lesbian, gay, bisexual, some other orientation besides straight, or transgender, while "straight and cisgender" refers to adults who identify as none of these. Where possible, we disaggregate these groups further by sexual orientation alone (lesbian, gay, or bisexual vs straight) or gender identity alone (transgender vs cisgender). As sample sizes permit, results for smaller demographic groups may be shown in the Connecticut crosstab, but not in crosstabs for smaller geographic regions. Some of the demographic data collected, such as self-identified neighborhood of residence, are not shown in the crosstab. Please contact DataHaven for additional details about these items. The sample size for our 2024 survey was larger than the sample size for the 2025 survey, so individuals seeking information about smaller population groups should consider consulting that document (at ctdatahaven.org/wellbeingsurvey).

Methodology

The DataHaven Community Wellbeing Survey was designed by DataHaven in consultation with an Advisory Council of over 300 local, statewide, and national survey research experts and local partners, in many cases drawing upon questions that have been used and validated through other large national survey programs. On behalf of DataHaven, the Siena Research Institute (SRI) at Siena University (formerly known as Siena College Research Institute) assisted in contacting randomly-selected residents for interviews and in completing live interviews by telephone. Siena Research Institute at Siena University, directed by Donald Levy, Ph.D., conducts political, economic, social, and cultural research. SRI, an independent, non-partisan research institute, subscribes to the American Association of Public Opinion Research Code of Professional Ethics and Practices. For the 2025 survey, 1,371 interviews were completed from August 4 to October 16, 2025. Residents age 18 and older were interviewed from all 169 towns in Connecticut. Interviews were conducted seamlessly in both English and Spanish, with 71% of all interviews (977 interviews) completed through live conversations with adults reached via cell phone and landline calls to listed and unlisted telephone numbers, incorporating random digit dialing (RDD) as well as a sample of dedicated wireless telephone exchanges from the area. For these calls, respondent sampling was initiated by asking for the youngest person in the household. To reach the most representative group of adults possible, this traditional telephone-based sample was supplemented with additional mixed-mode recruitment of adults (29% of the entire sample) through physical mail pieces and packages sent to randomly-selected mailing addresses (40 interviews), by text messages to cell phone owners (194 interviews), and by interviews gathered from an online panel of respondents provided by Cint, a market research platform (160 interviews). The samples drawn for the online panel matched a set of demographic quotas on age, gender, race/ethnicity, and place of residence. Respondents were sent directly to survey software operated by the Siena College Research Institute. All respondents that took the survey online completed attention checks during the survey to ensure proper attention was being paid throughout the entire survey. A small share of respondents received monetary incentives for their participation, typically if they were prompted to open and reply to a physical mail piece and/or if they were asked to complete a longer branch of interview questions relating to family and child well-being. The family and child well-being questions are asked to a smaller sample, following completion of the main survey, so results for those are not shown here. Telephone sampling was conducted via a stratified dual frame probability sample of landline and cell phone numbers weighted to reflect known population patterns. The landline telephone sample was obtained from ASDE and the cell phone sample was obtained from MSG. Utilizing this database allowed the inclusion of non-Connecticut telephone numbers as someone may have moved and their billing address is in the area but their cell phone number is not a "typical" CT telephone number (meaning not a 203 or 860 area code). Again, all of these respondents were screened for residence in the qualifying area before continuing. Interviews conducted online were excluded from the sample and final analysis if they failed any data quality attention check question. Duplicate responses were identified by their response ID and removed from the sample. Three questions were asked of online respondents including a honey-pot question to catch bots and two questions ask the respondent to follow explicit directions. The proprietary panel also incorporates measures that "safeguard against automated bot attacks, deduplication issues, fraudulent VPN usage, and suspicious IP addresses." Coding of open-ended responses was done by a single human coder.

DataHaven applied weighting by using the anesrake R package and 2020 Census data, considering each respondent's age, sex, reported race/ethnicity, telephone ownership status based on the National Health Interview Survey (cell phone only, landline only, or both), and town of residence in comparison to the characteristics of the total adult population of the area. DataHaven created unique raking weights for each respondent and for each individual geographic area. This approach is a reliable way to ensure that the estimates we produce are statistically representative of the entire adult population of the area being reported on. Sampling error is only one of many potential sources of error and there may be other unmeasured error in this or any other survey.
